The ad-hoc MACRAD Transfer Equivalency Navigation System (M-TENS) committee continues to move forward with the Michigan Transfer Network, in response to the Cherry Commission's 2004 recommendation. A pilot program will be ready this spring and, if successful, a full launch should occur later in the year. This project will make it much easier for students to find out how their credits will transfer to 4-year schools in the state, all via one website. A committee of MACRAD members will continue to oversee

this project for three years, evaluating the service, its usage, and member input.

MACRAD is truly an organization to be proud of! I am happy to relay the positive feedback from AACRAD leadership about the quality and scope of our activities—we really are one of the top state or regional groups in the country. Grant will send two members to annual conference

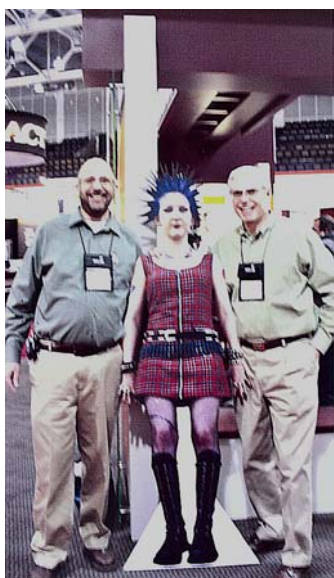

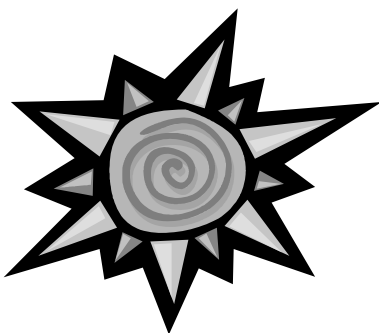

Michigan Transfer Network

Contract Finalized

On February 1, 2007, MACRAO President Paula Dykstra signed a contract with Michigan State University to create the Michigan Transfer Network (MTN). The MTN is MACRAO's answer to the Cherry Commission's charge for the creation of a "transfer wizard" to help increase degree completion statewide. This online resource will be available to all MACRAO member institutions to post their transfer-in course equivalences. Students will use the web site as a central source of information about transfer between Michigan colleges.

In May 2005, the MACRAO Executive Committee moved "on behalf of the MACRAO membership and to benefit all Michigan college and university students...(to create) the ad-hoc committee for the MACRAO Transfer Equivalency Navigation System (M-TENS) and charges them with start-up, development, creation, and implementation" of M-TENS. Over the next year and a half, the M-TENS committee developed the specifications for this system, now known as the Michigan Transfer Network (MTN). Numerous meetings, several presentations at MACRAO events, and a tremendous team effort by the committee led to an economically feasible plan with Michigan State University to create and host the MTN.

A Tentative Timeline

- January to February 2007: Web site and database development
- February to March 2007: Alpha schools (Calvin, Macomb, Michigan State University, Oakland University) data load
- April to June 2007: Beta schools (TBD) data load
- July 2007: Open to all MACRAO member institutions for data loading
- August 2007: Web site live for students

Throughout implementation, the ad-hoc committee plans to educate our colleagues on the MTN by attending as many professional meetings across the state as possible. In addition, the ad-hoc committee hopes to attend, or host, workshops where MACRAO members can learn more about participation and the technical aspects of the MTN.

For a primer, data loading will be possible via a few popular file formats or manually. The details are currently being developed.

Both the M-TENS web site (www.m-tens.org) and the MTN web site (www.MichiganTransferNetwork.org) will include technical information about participation. Please note, at press time the MTN web site was not yet operational. The ad-hoc M-TENS committee welcomes questions and comments.
