MACRAO Represented at PALA

What's PALA? Howard Shanken, MACRAO president and Paul Schmidt, coordinator of the Michigan Transfer Network, represented our organization at the first meeting of the Professional Associations Leadership Alliance (PALA) which met in Lansing on June 3.

The PALA is an initiative of the Michigan Community Colleges Association (MCCA) that was conceived to explore communication, partnerships, linkages and relationships among and between the various community college professional associations (although it should be noted that several associations such as MACRAO represent more than community colleges).

The meeting was well attended with representatives from almost all organizations participating. In addition to getting acquainted, topics of discussion included:

- The Michigan New Jobs Training Program initiative, a proposal to allow community colleges to issue bonds for occupational training which would be retired by captured state income taxes.
- The Community College Baccalaureate Degree proposal, which would allow certain specific regional community colleges to award bachelor's degrees in technical fields and applied sciences.
- The P20 database, a unit records system for Michigan students from pre-school to the awarding of the final graduate degree—a hot topic for many on the association.

Each of these topics is being discussed by the legislature; two already have bills prepared and submitted. Much discussion lies ahead and you will be hearing more about these initiatives in the months to come.

Support Staff Workshop Rejuvenates

The 2008 Support Staff Workshop was held at the Orchard Ridge campus of Oakland Community College on June 13, 2008. Seventy-one attendees from sixteen institutions participated in this year's workshop "Effort Makes the Difference," presented by Mary Ann Troy.
