Re-Visiting Underlying MiTransfer Pathways Assumptions

- Required, recommended, optional, and appropriate courses should meet degree requirements.
- Courses in the **first- and second- year** should typically be completed in the first 60 hours, or first half, of the program.
- Some **students will enroll part-time** and take longer to complete the courses and associate degree.
- Assume that the student has **selected a major**.
- These pathways focus on students who intend to earn an associate degree and a bachelor's degree.

MiTransfer Pathways Institutional Scale of Adoption

- In these first four pathways, each community college has
 67 "new" transfer partners.
- In these first four pathways, each university has **112** "new" community college partners.
- Across the four pathways, 8,000+ direct equivalencies are ensured.

Initative Spotlight - Transfer Pathways Urana Pridemore - Associate Director of Admissions

Transfer Pathways is a state-wide initiative to increase degree completion among transfer students. It is an ongoing conversation between faculty and administrators of 4 year colleges, public and private, and community colleges. Provosts and Administrators outlined 12 Pathways to cover, broken up into three implementation phases. Faculty members then came together and discussed how their classes articulate, or are equal from one college to another. Faculty from other institutions reviewed one another's syllabi and came up with the classes that align between 4 year and community colleges. Urana says, "through this conversation, faculty were able to see how similar their classes are and if there were differences, figure out how to bridge the gap. Because of this, partnerships with community colleges were strengthened and solidified."

Starting with 2019-2020 we are adding each new articulation agreement to our undergraduate catalog.

Including our articulation agreements in our catalog serves two purposes:

- 1. A source of information for students and advisors
- 2. Informs our graduation advisors on substitutions, waivers, etc. that are included in each agreement.

Communication [BA] - Washtenaw

Return to: Programs by Program Type

This major is built off of an articulation agreement, a specialized agreement between a four-year university, in this case, Eastern Michigan University, and a community college. Faculty from both schools collaborated to design an agreement that facilitates the smooth transfer of course credit from a two-year associate's degree program to a four-year bachelor's degree program.

This agreement is effective *Fall 2018 - Summer 2021*. Students have until <u>Summer 2026</u> to graduate from Eastern Michigan University using this agreement.

The undergraduate program in Communication, leading to a Bachelor of Arts degree, is one of the largest programs in the College of Arts and Sciences. As a student in Communication, you'll explore the impact and influence of communication in personal, professional, and public contexts and learn the fundamentals and techniques that give effective communication the power to inform and to persuade.

MiTransfer Pathways

All four Phase I pathways are built in our 2020-2021 Undergraduate Catalog. The 2020-2021 catalog will be available to the public on March 1st.

Psychology [BS] - MiTransfer Pathway

This major is built to facilitate the transferral of courses to Eastern Michigan University, from all 28 community colleges in Michigan. Faculty from across the state identified courses a student may take in the first and second year of the bachelor's degree programs at all participating universities. The MiTransfer Pathways courses in psychology are:

- Abnormal Psychology (PSY 360 Approved Courses)
- Developmental Psychology (Not offered)
